How to Use the Platform

Step 2: Creating an Artist Account

After registration, log in and access the menu bar. Click on "Profile" and then select "Workshop." Here, you can view workshop data and check the list of participants. Enhance your workshop's description by providing detailed information about yourself as an artist and your project. You can also include links to videos and social media accounts. Additionally, enter location details by selecting the country, city, and integrating Google Maps.

Step 3: Creating an Offer

To create an offer, fill out the provided form with relevant information. Similar to workshops, the more details you provide, the more appealing your offer will be. The aim is to direct interested parties to your personal homepage or social media pages for further information. However, the ARTcoWORKers platform allows for news integration as well.

Step 4: Adding News

Integrating news into the platform is simple. Provide a title, a short excerpt, and the news content. Ensure that you include a relevant title image and include any necessary links.

Videos and tutorials play a vital role in the ArtCoWorkers training program.

Below we describe the design approach and key elements used in our shadow theatre inspired video production. The main goal was to create visually captivating content while effectively emphasising certain statements and positions. Here is an overview of the design concept, the incorporation of shadow puppets and the strategic use of large, legible letters for textual emphasis.

Design concept:

The video production was designed to resemble a shadow theatre performance, with the speaker appearing on a monitor surrounded by floating shadows. This concept aimed to add an element of fascination and visual appeal to the presentation while keeping the focus on the speaker's message. By combining traditional shadow puppetry techniques with modern technology, the design team wanted to create a unique and engaging visual experience for the audience.

Incorporating shadow puppets:

The main visual element of the video production was the use of shadow puppets that floated around the monitor with the speaker. These shadows were carefully designed to move in a way that complemented the speaker's gestures and emphasised his words. The fluid and subtle movements of the shadows aimed to capture the audience's attention without distracting or overpowering the main speaker.

Highlighting statements with large letters:


To further enhance the impact of certain statements and positions, individual words were displayed in the video in large, visible and legible letters. These words appeared within the video frame, strategically positioned to reinforce the speaker's message. The deliberate placement and typography of these highlighted words drew the viewer's attention and emphasised the importance of the information being conveyed.

Utility and effectiveness:


The shadow theatre-inspired video design offered several benefits in terms of visual impact and message delivery. By combining the captivating visual elements of shadow theatre with modern video production techniques, the design managed to engage viewers and keep their interest throughout the presentation. The use of shadow puppets added an element of mystery and enchantment to the presentation, while the highlighted words ensured that important statements and positions were effectively emphasised, enhancing retention and comprehension of the message.

<u>Video 2:</u> Self-Knowledge: Rekka Imola Makkai from VitalPed discusses the topic of creativity and its significance in self-knowledge.







<u>Video 8</u>: Accessible Shadow-Theatre: In the last video, Hilda Kerekes from the Hungarian partner People First gives an insight into why shadow theater is particularly suitable for artistic collaboration between people with and without disabilities.



Note: All videos are in English – except the videos from Veronika Pataki, these are spoken in German - but have subtitles in DE (German), HUN (Hungarian), MAZ (Macedonian), and NL (Dutch) to ensure accessibility for non-English speakers.
